Safety Updates

Omak School District Superintendent, Michael Porter and East Omak Elementary Principal, LeeAnn Schrock met with Colville Tribal Police Chief, Steve Brown on Thursday, February 23rd to discuss recent issues occurring around the school campus. East's garden shed was recently broken into with miscellaneous garden supplies and a wheelbarrow taken. In a separate incident, a baggie containing an unknown white substance was found in the parking lot by maintenance staff. Additionally, there was an individual walking on the sidewalk with an airsoft gun but quickly crossed the street and disappeared. Police were contacted in all three events and either Tribal Police or Omak City Police responded. Colville Tribal Police has increased patrols around East, and we are grateful for their presence. In order to stay vigilant in maintaining a safe learning environment, we ask that parents report any concerning activity on the school campus to the office.
