4. STUDENT REPORTS

4.01 Student Report – Jonathan Kirk and Angelica Rodriguez

Board representative Jonathan Kirk shared club and sports information with the board. Angelica Rodriguez was unable to attend. Chairman Dennis Carlton thanked him for his report.

5. GOOD NEWS

The following individuals shared the good news that is happening within the school district:

• East Elementary Assistant Principal Kim DeHart first wanted to highlight the continued generosity of our community. An Omak graduate and her husband recently donated 75 pairs of shoes for our students, and local businesses donated coats, hoodies, and food supplies for many building activities. Their annual Turkey Bingo was held on November 20th with a great

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turnout and most families left the event with a full turkey dinner. Golden Awards will be this Friday, the annual coin drive will be December $11^{\text{th}} - 14^{\text{th}}$ to be donated to our local Kiwanis Christmas Basket, and their holiday concert is scheduled for December 13th to be held at the Performing Arts Center.

- North Elementary Assistant Principal Chris Miller shared that we are so proud of our own Constanza Smith, who was awarded Omak's Citizen of the Year. Students will participate in the annual coin drive for our local Kiwanis Christmas Basket, and they have also been fortunate to receive many generous donations for our students from local businesses and community members, along with a shoe donation from an Omak graduate and her husband. Their building highlighted Native American Day with dancers, storytellers, and drummers from Paschal Sherman Indian School. Preschool students learned about fry bread, baby boards, and many other Native American cultures. Their building also recognized community member Veterans at this year's Veterans Day Assembly.
- Middle School Assistant Principal Lance O'Dell shared that their JOM program prepared a cookoff today and served the entire middle school smoked salmon and fry bread. The Nature and Emergent Program took a field trip to Green Lake before Thanksgiving break with a large group of students participating. The program is having a very positive influence on our students. This year's parent-teacher-student conferences were well attended. Our staff is implementing many new ways to motivate and encourage students. This year's first look at data shows a huge improvement over last year with a substantial increase in positive behavior.
- High School Principal David Kirk shared that November is Native American appreciation month. Their building's JOM program also provided smoked salmon and fry bread for students and staff, adding "Rock Your Mocs" with students wearing traditional moccasins. Our football team lost in the playoff game to Royal City ending this year's season. Winter sports are going well, with our first home games starting this week. FFA students rocked it again, preparing 860 apple pies for their annual fundraiser. They were also recognized as Rangeland Management State Champions and placed second at Nationals. Our student board member, Jonathan Kirk, has received an Air Force ROTC Type 1 four-year scholarship, along with other Seniors beginning to receive college acceptance letters.
- Superintendent Michael Porter shared that some of our teaching staff have received \$300 grants awarded by the North Central ESD or the Okanogan County School Retirees Program. East Elementary has received a bicycle grant from the North Central ESD, where 30 bicycles are delivered to area schools on a rotational basis for three weeks to teach bike safety to students. Our bus garage has once again received 100% on its annual Washington State Patrol inspection this year, but also passed all areas on the recent surprise inspection. We have added a new bus to our fleet and took its first route to Conconully this afternoon.
- Board Director Dennis Carlton congratulated our middle school basketball players with a win over Okanogan.
